PROP 28 ARTS AND MUSIC IN SCHOOLS PLANNING TOOLKIT

HOW TO ENSURE EQUITABLE ACCESS TO QUALITY ARTS EDUCATION

In November 2022, California voters passed Proposition 28, the Arts and Music In Schools (AMS) Act, which will provide ongoing annual funding for arts education. In the first year, the 2023/24 school year, California public schools will receive \$938 million for the arts.

Prop 28 AMS brings a historic opportunity for schools and districts to invest in arts education to help all students succeed in school and life and reach their career goals.

The Prop 28 AMS Planning Toolkit, developed in consultation with arts education field leaders, will help Local Education Agency (LEA) administrators, school site staff, and their allies collaborate to effectively plan for Prop 28 AMS and strategize to build or further develop a comprehensive arts program in dance, media arts, music, theatre, and visual arts in every school and grade level.

The toolkit includes profiles of school districts' efforts to develop arts programs, Common Questions, and templates to aid Prop 28 AMS planning.
